
#### REPORT FOR AUGUST 2020 YTD TRADE

#### August Exports Stabilize Slightly Above 2019









## Total per capita meat consumption was down 4.5% in 2020 with a 7% decline in red meat

## Canadian Per Capita Total Meat Consumption







## Percent Change in Canadian & U.S. Per Capita Beef Consumption






### **Canadian Real Meat Expenditures**

### **Meat Market Share by Value**






## CDN Retail beef demand +5.5% US retail beef demand +7.5%

### **U.S. Retail Beef Demand Index**








# Retail beef price in April up 3.7% from LY and up 3.8% from the 5-yr avg


## **2021 Demand??**

  - Real disposable income?



### **US Weekly Select Cutout Values**








## Loin and Rib primals appear to have peaked









## Lean trim prices are strong; 50% trim typical

### **US Weekly 85% Trim Values**



### **Alberta Weekly D2 Cow Price**








## Beef Imports Jan-April -13% in volume from 2020




### **Canadian Beef Imports 2020**
















### **Alberta Weekly Fed Steer Price**

Alberta/Nebraska in Cdn \$ - Cash to Cash





## Strong feeder basis attracting imports


### Alberta Feeder Basis, 850 lb Steer






# Feeder imports double Jan-April at 133,457 hd Feeder exports -54% at 25,305 hd

Live Beef Cattle Imports (excluding Pure-Bred Breeding) from the United States










# Record high feed costs supported by weather and strong feed grain exports











# Cattle on Feed 120+ days dn 44,600 head from 5yr avg






## US Placements still below 2019 (Jan-April), fewer feeders outside of feedlots, front end supplies ample

## **Summary**

- Large domestic supplies in 1H 2021
  - YTD Slaughter +16%
  - Carcass weights +9lbs
  - Domestic beef production +18.5%
  - Beef exports +23% (Jan-April), +25% from 5-yr avg
  - Packing plant Utilization +8 percentage points from 5-yr avg at 94%
- Supplies in 2H 2021 to remain above 5-yr avg
  - Beef will continue to fill red meat demand domestically
  - Large production will support export volumes
  - International demand remains strong for beef
    - NA pork exports could soften with lower Chinese hog prices
    - CDN pork exports +4% Jan-April but plants delisted
